#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2025

#### DRAINAGE PROJECT

Thanks to the generosity of the Remp-Sawyer Community Fund of the Northern New York Community Foundation, we now have a dry crawl space under our Conference Building. This essential building houses historic photographs and intriguing artifacts.

Water was entering the crawlspace during snowmelt season and heavy rainfall events. To remedy the situation, volunteers used an excavator to dig down along the building where drain tile and pipe were installed to divert the water. A truckload of stone in the ditch acts as the catch basin. While the foundation was exposed, a rotten rim joist was replaced. The project also included having the crawlspace interior walls spray foamed.

The museum is very grateful for this generous grant allowing us to accomplish such a successfully completed drainage project.





#### BOB SLED CONVERSION TO GARDEN

Thanks to Stewart's, the Dade Family Foundation and dedicated volunteers, the bob sled was rebuilt and fitted with an old stock tank that serves as an attractive giant flower bed.



#### POSTER CONTEST

With the help of the Adirondack Central School District art teachers in the upper schools, students in the middle school and high school were challenged to produce posters showing some aspect of the Black River Canal and Museum. The only requirement was the inclusion of the Museum logo in the work.

The results were simply amazing in both quality and quantity. Judging was very difficult and we appreciate the effort by all who participated.


The finalists in the middle school were Ariel Cormier, first place, and Molly Seiger, runner up.
